October is National Crime Prevention Month. On Tuesday, Oct. 13, the Sheriff's Office was presented with a proclamation from commissioners designating October as crime prevention month in Citrus County.

During the remainder of the month, Sgt. Chris Evan, who heads up the community affairs section of the Sheriff's Office, will be joining the agency's community resource officers in a community outreach project called Operation Meet & Greet.

For the second year, they'll be going door to door in different areas of the county and not only handing out crime prevention materials, but engaging citizens one on one about the importance of minimizing security risks and preventing crime. Additionally, deputies will distribute literature about the new Crime Stoppers of Citrus County program, plus information about the agency's online CrimeMapping program, which is accessible for the public's use. In other words, deputies will be taking crime prevention directly to the people.
